By Air: The nearest airport is Lokpriya Gopinath Bordoloi International Airport, Guwahati, approximately 110 kilometers away.

By Rail: The closest railway station is Rangiya Jn., situated about 50 kilometers from the university. Regular trains connect Rangiya to major cities in Assam and other parts of India. From the station, local taxis and buses are available to reach the campus.

By Road: Nasatra is well-connected by road. It is approximately 120 kilometers from Guwahati, the capital city of Assam. Buses and private vehicles ply regularly from Guwahati to Nasatra, near Krishnaguru Adhyatmik Visvavidyalaya.
